CAL NORTHERN SCHOOL OF LAW

1. Information re the law school's admissions, enrollment, faculty, and tuition.

Cal Northern School of Law (CNSOL), located in Chico, timely-filed its 2015 Annual Report. Dean Sandra Brooks continues to be its dean; Ms. Marty Gosling acts as the school's Registrar.

CNSOL reported a current enrollment of 42 J.D. students for the 2014-2015 academic year: 16, 1st year students, five, 2nd year students, 12, 3rd year students and nine, 4th year students. There is one special student currently enrolled as a 1st year student.

The law school raised its tuition for its four-year J.D. degree program to \$42,808.00, plus fees. The law school received 25 applications for its 2015-2016 academic year; of the 22 admitted, 18 have a four-year college degree, three were admitted with sufficient college credit and one was admitted without the minimum 60 units of acceptable college credit as a "special student" based upon their CLEP scores.

CNSOL reported 16 part-time faculty members, including three new hires: Ms. Laura Jane Davis, a licensed California attorney and graduate of Stanford Law School; Mr. Randy G. Lockwood, also admitted to practice law in California and alumnus of the University of Utah College of Law; and Ms. Melanie Ann Snider a licensed California attorney and graduate of University of the Pacific McGeorge School of Law.

2. Major Change Requests Granted and New Waiver Requests.

Over the past year, CNSOL reported no major changes requiring notice to the Committee of Bar Examiners and submitted no waiver requests.

3. Cumulative, Minimum Pass Rate (MPR) – First-Time Pass Rates.

CNSOL reported a compliant MPR of 82% for the 2009-2014 reporting period, with 36 of 44 graduates passing the California Bar Examination (CBX) during the reporting period.

For the two most recent CBX administrations, CNSOL reported a first-time pass rate for its most-recent graduates as follows: February, 2015: 0% (0/0); July, 2015: 30% (3/10).

Empire College School of Law (ECSOL), located in Santa Rosa, timely-filed its 2015 Annual Report. Dean William A. Robertson retired effective

ECSOL reported a current enrollment of 97 in the J.D. Program for the 2015-2016 academic year: 36, 1st year students, 24, 2nd year students, 22, 3rd year students and 13, 4th year students. There are two special students currently enrolled as 4th year students. The law school also reported six students enrolled in its Masters of Laws degree program.

The law school raised its tuition for its four-year J.D. degree program to \$63,360.00, plus fees. The law school received 54 applications for its 2015-2016 academic year; of the 49 admitted, 46 have a four-year college degree and three were admitted with sufficient acceptable college credit.

ECSOL reported 57 part-time faculty members, including seven new hires: Mr. Murray Cockerill, a licensed California attorney and graduate of Empire College School of Law; Ms. Marianna Green, also admitted to practice law in California and alumnus of the Willamette University College of Law; Mr. Michael D. Green a licensed California attorney and graduate of the University of Denver, College of Law; Mr. Brendan Kunkle a licensed California attorney and graduate of Golden Gate University School of Law; Mr Daniel Joseph Lanahan, III, also admitted to practice law in California and alumnus of Empire College School of Law; Ms. Robyn Lee Mancini a licensed California attorney and graduate of Empire College School of Law; Mr. Anthony Richard Zunino, also admitted to practice law in California and alumnus of Empire College School of Law.

Over the past year, ECSOL reported no major changes requiring notice to the Committee of Bar Examiners.

In 2015, the law school received two waivers from the Committee regarding the time limitation regarding two students that will allow each to receive their J.D. degrees beyond the 84-month time restriction found in Guideline 6.5.

ECSOL reported a compliant MPR of 72% for the 2009-2014 reporting period, with 65 of 90 graduates passing the CBX during the reporting period.

GLENDALE UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF LAW

1. Information re the law school's admissions, enrollment, faculty and tuition.

Glendale University College of Law (GUCOL) located in Glendale, timely-filed its 2015 Annual Report. Dean Darrin Greitzer continues to be its dean; Ms. Kimberly Greitzer acts as the school's Registrar.

GUCOL reported a current enrollment of 104 in its J.D. Program for the 2015-2016 academic year: 41, 1st year students, 20, 2nd year students, 26, 3rd year students and 17, 4th year students.

The law school raised its tuition for its four-year J.D degree program to \$66,000.00, plus fees. The law school received 113 applications for its 2015-2016 academic year, of the 60 admitted, 46 were admitted with a four-year college degree and 14 with sufficient, acceptable college credit.

GUCOL reported 25 part-time faculty members, including two new instructors: Mr. Lawrence L. Hafetz, a licensed California attorney who earned his degree at the University of Michigan Law School; Ms. Tamara M. Kurtzman, also admitted to practice law in California who is a graduate of Case Western Reserve University School of Law.

2. Major Change Requests Granted and New Waiver Requests.

Over the past year, GUCOL reported no major changes requiring notice to the Committee of Bar Examiners and submitted no waiver request.

3. Cumulative, Minimum Pass Rate (MPR) – First-Time Pass Rates.

GUCOL timely-reported a compliant MPR of 64.2% for the 2009-2014 reporting period, with 52 of 81 graduates passing the CBX during the reporting period.

Over the past year, LDSOL reported no major changes requiring notice to the Committee of Bar Examiners and submitted no waiver request.

3. Cumulative, Minimum Pass Rate (MPR) – First-Time Pass Rates.

LDSOL timely-reported a compliant MPR of 50% for the 2009-2014 reporting period, with 79 of 158 graduates passing the CBX during the reporting period.

For the two most recent CBX administrations, LDSOL reported first-time CBX pass rates for its most-recent graduates as follows: February, 2015: 50% (7/14); July, 2014: 13% (2/16).

JOHN F. KENNEDY UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF LAW

John F. Kennedy University College of Law (JFKCOL), located in Pleasant Hill, timely-filed its 2015 Annual Report. Dean Barbieri continues as its dean; Ms. Robin Galguera acts as the school's Registrar.

JFKCOL reported a current enrollment of 113 in the J.D. Program for the 2015-2016 academic year: 30, 1st year students, 32, 2nd year students, 21, 3rd year students and 30, 4th year students.

The law school raised its tuition for its three and four-year J.D. degree program to \$77,028.00, plus fees. It received 80 applications for its 2015-2016 academic year, of the 34 admitted, 29 have a four-year college degree and five were admitted with sufficient acceptable college credit.

LLSS reported a current enrollment of 238 J.D. students for the 2015-2016 academic year: 88, 1st year students, 60, 2nd year students, 39, 3rd year students and 51, 4th year students.

The law school raised its tuition for its four-year J.D. degree program to \$45,150.00, plus fees. The law school received 154 applications for its 2015-2016 academic year, of the 130 admitted, 106 were admitted with a four-year college degree and 24 were admitted with sufficient acceptable college credit.

LLSS reported 1 full-time faculty member and 24 part-time faculty members, including 3 new instructors: The Honorable Michael Bowman, a licensed California attorney who earned his degree at the University of the Pacific's McGeorge School of Law and since 2014, has been a member of the Sacramento Superior Court; Ms. Lisa Kobayashi, who is also admitted to practice law in California and an alumnus of the University of California at

Lincoln Law School of San Jose (LLSSJ) timely-filed its 2015 Annual Report. Dean Joseph H. Moless, Jr. retired effective March 31, 2015 and Ms. Laura Palazzolo was initially appointed Interim Dean and, effective October 1, 2015, she was appointed Dean; Ms. Cindy Ruggiero acts as the school's Registrar.

LLSSJ reported a current enrollment of 63 J.D. students for the 2015-2016 academic year: 18, 1st year students, 18, 2nd year students, 14, 3rd year students and 13, 4th year students.

The law school raised its tuition for its four-year J.D. degree program to \$65,268.00, plus fees. It received 40 applications for its 2015-2016 academic year, of the 37 admitted, students were admitted with a four-year college degree and three with sufficient acceptable college credit.

LLSSJ reported 43 part-time faculty members, including seven new instructors: Mr. Patrick M. Hammon, a licensed California attorney and graduate of the University of California at Los Angeles School of Law; Mr. David Henningsen, also admitted to practice law in California and alumnus of the University of Seattle; Mr. Johnny Cepeda Gogo a licensed California attorney and graduate of Thomas Jefferson School of Law; Ms. Sue Saign a licensed California attorney and graduate of Lincoln Law School of San Jose; Mr. Phillip B. For the two most recent CBX administrations, LLSSJ reported first-time CBX pass rates for its most-recent graduates as follows: February 2015, 0% (0/2); July 2015, 20% (2/10).

MONTEREY COLLEGE OF LAW

1. Information re the law school's admissions, enrollment, faculty and tuition.

Monterey College of Law (MCL), located in Seaside, timely-filed its 2015 Annual Report. Dean Mitchel L. Winick continues as its dean; Shashi Chand acts as the school's Registrar.

MCL, including its branch campus located in San Luis Obispo and satellite campus in Santa Cruz, reported a combined current enrollment of 128 J.D. students for the 2015-2016 academic year: 42, 1st year students, 35, 2nd year students, 23, 3rd year students and 25, 4th year students. There are three special student currently enrolled: one as a 1st year student; one as a 2nd year student; one as a 3rd year student.

The law school raised its tuition for its four-year J.D. degree program to \$71,550.00, plus fees. The law school and branch received 91 applications for its 2015-2016 academic year and of the 78 admitted, 70 have a four-year college degree, six were admitted with sufficient college credit and two were admitted without the minimum 60 units of acceptable college credit as a "special student" based upon their CLEP scores

MCL reported 57 part-time faculty members, including five newly-hired instructors: Ms. Jennifer Davenport, a licensed California attorney who earned her degree at The Catholic University of America Columbus School of Law;

A waiver request was submitted regarding the six-unit limitation set out in Guideline 5.8 to allow MCL to accept, as transfer units, additional credit earned by students at an unaccredited law school who have not passed the First-Year Law Students' Examination. The waiver was granted.

3. Cumulative, Minimum Pass Rate (MPR) – First-Time Pass Rates

MCL reported a compliant MPR of 57% for the 2009-2014 reporting period, with 47 of 82 graduates passing the CBX during the reporting period.

For the two most recent CBX administrations, MCL reported first-time pass rates for its most-recent graduates as follows: February 2015, 60% (6/10); July 2015, 25% (2/8).

PACIFIC COAST UNIVERSITY, SCHOOL OF LAW

1. Information re the law school's admissions, enrollment, faculty and tuition.

Pacific Coast University School of Law (PCU), located in Long Beach, timely filed its 2015 Annual Report. Dean Charles Hicks was replaced by the Board effective June 5, 2015 and Andrea L. Lua was appointed as the Interim Dean. Ms. Maren Carmona was appointed as the school's Registrar, full-time administrator and Dean of Students.

PCU reported a current enrollment of 168 J.D. students for the 2015-2016 academic year: 45, 1st year students, 45, 2nd year students, 38, 3rd year students and 40, 4th year students.

The law school raised its tuition for its four-year J.D. degree program to \$26,000.00, plus fees. The law school received 84 applications for its 2015-2016 academic year and of the 64 admitted, 55 were admitted with a four-year college degree and seven were admitted with sufficient college credit.

3. Cumulative, Minimum Pass Rate (MPR) – First-Time Pass Rates

PCU reported a non-compliant MPR of 28.2% for the 2009-2014 reporting period, with 22 of 78 graduates passing the CBX during the reporting period. Due to its non-compliant MPR, the Committee authorized staff to issue PCU a Notice of Noncompliance.

For the two most recent CBX administrations, PCU reported first-time pass rates for its most-recent graduates as follows: February 2015, 9% (11); July 2015, 9% (3/35).

SAN FRANCISCO LAW SCHOOL

1. Information re the law school's admissions, enrollment, faculty and tuition.

San Francisco Law School (SFLS) timely-filed its 2015 Annual Report. Dean Jane L. O'Hara Gamp resigned in December 2015 and, effective January 1, 2016, Gregory J. Brandes was appointed as Dean; Ms. Patricia Alley remains as the school's Registrar.

SFLS and its branch located in San Diego reported a current enrollment of 60 J.D students for the 2015-2016 academic year: 23, 1st year students, 17, 2nd year students, 14, 3rd year students and 6, 4th year students.

The law school raised its tuition for its four-year J.D. program to \$73,950.00, plus fees. The law school received 86 applications for its 2015-2016 academic year and of the 30 admitted, all held a four-year college degree.

SFLS reported 2 full-time faculty members and 41 part-time faculty members, including one new instructor: Ms. Debra A Morse a licensed California attorney who earned her degree at University of San Diego School of Law.

SFLS reported a compliant MPR of 63% for the 2009-2014 reporting period, with 40 of 64 graduates passing the CBX during the reporting period.

For the two most recent CBX administrations, SFLS reported first-time pass rates for its most-recent graduates as follows: February 2015, 50% (1/2); July 2015, 7% (2/27).

SAN JOAQUIN COLLEGE OF LAW

1. Information re the law school's admissions, enrollment, faculty and tuition.

San Joaquin College of Law (SJCOL), located in Clovis, timely-filed its 2015 Annual Report. Dean Janice Pearson continues as its dean; Joyce Morodomi acts as the school's Registrar.

SJCOL reported a current enrollment of 183 J.D. students for the 2015-2016 academic year: 69, 1st year students, 36, 2nd year students, 31, 3rd year students and 47, 4th year students.

The law school raised its tuition for its four-year J.D. program to \$79,550, plus fees. The law school received 153 applications for its 2015-2016 academic year and of the 83 admitted, 71 were admitted with a four-year college degree and 11 were admitted with sufficient college credit.

SJCOL reported 10 full-time and 25 part-time faculty members, including four new instructors: Ms. Nikole Elizabeth Cunningham, a licensed California attorney and a graduate of the University of the Pacific McGeorge School of Law; Mr. Marc James Days, also admitted in California and an alumnus of the University of Virginia School of Law; Mr. Nelson Ryan Richards, admitted to practice law in California and an alumnus of University of California at Berkeley School of Law; Ms. Anastasya A. Uskov, admitted to practice law in

Based upon prior waivers granted, SJCOL may grant up to 14 units of non-classroom, academic credit for students participating in an approved legal internship or an on-campus legal clinic.

This request to renew its earlier-granted waiver will be considered by the Committee at its January meeting.

3. Cumulative, Minimum Pass Rate (MPR) – First-Time Pass Rates

SJCOL reported a compliant MPR of 83% for the 2009-2014 reporting period with 180 of 218 graduates passing the CBX during the reporting period.

For the two most recent CBX administrations, SJCOL reported first-time CBX pass rates for its most-recent graduates as follows: February 2015, 0% (0/1); July 2015, 29% (9/31).

SANTA BARBARA COLLEGE OF LAW

1. Information re the law school's admissions, enrollment faculty and tuition.

Santa Barbara College of Law (SBCOL) timely-filed its 2015 Annual Report. In January 2016, Dean Heather Georgakis announced that she was retiring as dean of the law school, effective at the end of the current academic year; Mary Osborne acts as the school's Registrar.

SBCOL reported a current enrollment of 70 J.D. students for the 2015-2016 academic year: 26, 1st year students, eight, 2nd year students, 21, 3rd year students and 14, 4th year students. There is one special student currently enrolled as a 2nd year student.

The law school raised its tuition for its four-year J.D. degree program to \$60,900.00, plus fees. The law school received 63 applications for its 2015-2016 academic year and of the 31 admitted, 26 were admitted with a four-year college degree and 5 were admitted with sufficient college credit.
