FIXED-FACILITY LAW SCHOOLS:

CALIFORNIA DESERT TRIAL ACADEMY, INDIO

1. Information re the law school's admissions, enrollment, faculty, and tuition.

California Desert Trial Academy (CDTA) filed its 2015 Annual Report late and paid the required fee. Dean John Patrick Dolan remains its dean. It has 18 part-time faculty members, three of whom are new and are teaching law for the first time; each new faculty members is licensed to practice law in California.

CDTA became a registered, unaccredited law school in June 2012. It reported an enrollment of 37 students for the 2015-2016 academic year: 12 1st year students, seven, 2nd year students, seven, 3rd year students and 11 4th year students.

The law school's tuition for its J.D. degree program is \$48,000.00, plus fees.

CDTA received 15 applications for its 2014-2015 academic year. Of the 14 admitted, 12 were first-year students and two were an advanced year students and each have a bachelor's degree.

2. Major Change Requests Granted

CDTA made and received Committee approval of two major changes in 2015: The first was relating to the relocation of its law library to a new facility and the second was relocation of the law school to a permanent new facility.

3. California Bar Examination (CBX) and First-Year Law Students' Examination (FYLSX) Pass Rates

First-time pass rates for CDTA students taking the two most-recent administrations of the FYLSX were: October 2014: 0.0% (0/0); June 2015: 12.5% (1/8). CDTA students' "all-takers" pass rates on the same FYLSX administrations were: October 2014: 42.9% (3/7); June 2015: 18.2% (2/11).

CDTA has not yet had any students graduate so it has no CBX statistics.

CALIFORNIA SOUTHERN LAW SCHOOL, RIVERSIDE

California Southern Law School (CSLS) timely filed its 2015 Annual Report. Interim Dean Jim Bishop remains in this position. The CSLS faculty consists

of 16 part-time members; one was recently hired and is teaching law for the first time and is admitted to practice law in California.

CSLS reported an enrollment of 62 students for the 2014-2015 academic year: 36, 1st year students, 11, 2nd year students, three 3rd year students and nine, 4th year students. It also enrolled three special students.

The law school's tuition for its J.D. degree program is \$33,600.00, plus fees.

CSLS received 112 applications for its 2015-2016 academic year. Of the 68 granted admission, 43 were first-year students and 25 were advanced year students; 39 students were admitted with a bachelor's degree, 26 earned at least 60 acceptable college credit required for a bachelor's degree and three were admitted as special students based upon the CLEP scores.

CSLS made no major change requests to the Committee in 2015.

3. California Bar Examination (CBX) and First-Year Law Students' Examination (FYLSX) Pass Rates

First-time pass rates for CSLS students taking the two most recent administrations of the FYLSX were: October 2014: 0.0% (0/0); June 2015: 29.6% (8/27). CSLS students' "all takers" pass rates on the same two FYLSX administrations were: October 2014: 22.2% (4/18); June 2015: 19.5% (8/41).

First-time pass rates for CSLS graduates taking the two most recent administrations of the CBX for which results are available are as follows: February 2015: 0.0% (0/0); July 2015: 40.0% (4/10).

CSLS had nine of its graduates pass the CBX in 2015.

Irvine University College of Law (IUCOL) timely-filed its 2015 Annual Report. Dean George J. Gliaudys Jr., remains its dean. The faculty consists of 27 part-time members with four new faculty members teaching law for the first time; all are admitted to practice law in California.

IUCOL reported an enrollment of 65 students for the 2015-2016 academic year: 53, 1st year students, four 2nd year student, two 3rd year student and five 4th year students. It also enrolled one special student.

AISOL reported an enrollment of 36 students for the 2015-2016 academic year: 30, 1st year students, three 2nd year students and three 3rd year students.

The law school's tuition for its J.D. degree program is \$8,900.00, plus fees.

AISOL received 100 applications for its 2014-2015 academic year.
