HISTORY OF LADY JUSTICE LAW SCHOOL

Lady Justice Law School is the third unaccredited, registered, fixed-facility law school to be established by one Californian family.

Twenty-five years ago, John Porter's brother, Charles, started a registered, unaccredited law school in Ridgecrest, California. Charles then opened a branch in San Luis Obispo, California.

Ten years ago, John Porter opened a registered, unaccredited law school in Bakersfield, California, which he subsequently sold to his partner.

Now, John Porter, his daughter Molly Brown, and partner Warren Record, have created Lady Justice Law School, a registered, unaccredited fixed-facility.

Lady Justice Law School will be the only law school in the greater Bakersfield area servicing over 500,000 people.

LJLS is excited to offer an affordable, quality education to people who would otherwise not be able to attend law school.

MISSION OF LADY JUSTICE LAW SCHOOL

The purpose of Lady Justice Law School is to provide an affordable, quality education for working adults, and others, in the community. Lady Justice aims to give students the opportunity they might not otherwise have to further their education, and to make a change in their careers and lives.

Bakersfield and the surrounding community totals over 500,000 people. There is presently no local law school available to meet the needs of this community. Over the years, there have been attempts to meet this need, but these law schools, for one reason or another, have failed and each closed. One of the problems with previous attempts has been that the school attempted to be a fully "accredited" three year law school and to grow in size to become a major institution.

Lady Justice has what is perhaps a more realistic appreciation for the needs of the community and for the economic realities of operating a law school here. It is recognition of the special needs of people who are employed full time and raising a family, and the needs of other people who cannot attend a full-time law school that has resulted in the state providing for the unaccredited law schools. These unaccredited law schools provide professional training towards a Juris Doctor to qualify the student to take the Bar Examination and/or to gain employment in an executive position.

At present, Lady Justice offers a Juris Doctor, also known as a J.D. The specific focus of the program is to prepare the student to pass the California Bar Examination and to prepare him or her to competently and ethically succeed in the legal profession – either in private practice or in a

public agency. This will be accomplished, not only by requiring satisfactory completion of the 14 topics tested by the State Bar of California (Crimes, Torts, Contracts, Criminal Procedure, Civil Procedure, Remedies, Wills and Succession, Trusts, Real Property, Community Property, Professional Responsibility, Constitutional Law, Business Associations and Evidence), but by requiring substantial instruction in writing, research, and pleadings.

Lady Justice requires a minimum of 84 units to receive a degree.

By the completion of the Juris Doctor, the student will be qualified to take, and pass, the State Bar Examinations and the Professional Responsibility Examination necessary to obtain licensing to practice law in California. The method of study – a combination of classroom lectures, classroom discussions of cases, classroom discussion of the philosophy of law, and frequent testing – is designed to both teach the law to the students and develop the students' ability to analyze problems and discuss the various sides of an issue; sometimes this is referred to as "thinking like a lawyer".

The mission of Lady Justice is to provide a quality legal education for working adults, and others, in the community. This is accomplished by thorough classroom training in both the "black letter law" and in the underlying philosophy of the law, by having part-time instructors that bring years of field experience into the classroom, and by having ample tutoring resources available to the students.

One unique feature of training at Lady Justice is frequent testing and graded homework assignments. It is typical of most law schools to have a single final examination at the end of the term that counts for all, or almost all, of the grade for that subject. At Lady Justice Law School, the use of frequent tests and homework assignments acts to reinforce learning and allows the student to monitor his progress so as to allow corrective action to be taken before the student is hopelessly behind. The goal at Lady Justice is that every student succeeds – not to "weed out the weak".

As more classes are added, local attorneys and judges will be employed as part-time instructors. This procedure will both keep costs down to keep the school economically viable and affordable to the students **and** provide professional training from people who are actually practicing in that profession, locally.

It is the policy of Lady Justice Law School to provide generous tutoring and counseling opportunities to the students. The use of local instructors will facilitate that access. It is a goal – admittedly not always achievable – of Lady Justice that every student pass the Bar Examination and go on to a successful career and life. We believe our use of local practitioners, readily available tutoring, and constant encouragement will help us help our students achieve that goal.
