# ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO PAY COSTS

On August 6, 2012, petitioner Gregory Brent Orton filed a motion seeking an extension of time to comply with the order assessing disciplinary costs in the above-captioned matter. Petitioner's motion was based on financial hardship and special circumstances. In support of his motion, petitioner filed a financial declaration with supporting documents. Petitioner requests that he be granted an extension to pay the full amount of the costs by December 1, 2012.

On August 14, 2012, the State Bar of California, Office of the Chief Trial Counsel (State Bar), by and through Deputy Trial Counsel Robert A. Henderson, filed a "non-opposition," requesting that the court "grant petitioner's motion to the extent it seeks an extension of time to pay the costs ordered by the Supreme Court."

In view of his financial hardship and good cause appearing, the court **ORDERS** that Gregory Brent Orton is **GRANTED** an extension of time to pay the full amount of the assessed costs in the above-captioned matter by December 10, 2012. It is also **ORDERED** that Gregory Brent Orton must make payments pursuant to the following schedule: (1) \$1,000 in disciplinary costs on or before September 10, 2012; (2) a minimum of \$500 on or before October 10, 2012; (3) a minimum of \$500 on or before November 10, 2012; and (3) the remaining amount due on or before December 10, 2012.

The court further **ORDERS** that if petitioner fails to make any payment of disciplinary costs as set forth pursuant to the schedule set forth in this order within the time provided therein or as may be modified by the State Bar Court pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 6086.10, subdivision (c), the remaining balance of the costs is due and payable immediately unless relief has been granted under the Rules of Procedure of the State Bar of California (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.134). The payment of costs remains enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.
