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This matter is before the court on CHRISTOPHER PHILLIP DOBBINS'S June 22, 2015, motion for extension of time to pay disciplinary costs that the Supreme Court imposed on him in this proceeding and June 22, 2015, motion to shorten the time for the State Bar to respond to the motion for extension of time to pay costs. On June 23, 2015, the Office of the Chief Trial Counsel of the State Bar of California filed a statement of nonopposition to both motions.

Dobbins has established sufficient hardship and other good cause to grant him an extension of time to pay the costs. Dobbins's motion to shorten time is now moot. Accordingly, the court will extend the time in which Dobbins must pay the costs and dismiss his moot motion.

**ORDER**


The court orders that Christopher Phillip Dobbins's June 22, 2015, motion for extension of time to pay disciplinary costs is GRANTED and that the time in which Dobbins must pay the costs imposed on him in the Supreme Court's April 29, 2014, order in *In re Christopher Phillip Dobbins on Discipline*, case number S216602 (State Bar Court case number 11-O-14778) is

EXTENDED as set forth *post*. (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 6086.10, subd. (c); Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.130(B).)

Christopher Phillip Dobbins must pay one-fourth of the costs with his State Bar of California membership fees for each of the years 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019. If Christopher Phillip Dobbins fails to pay any installment as described above, or as may be hereafter modified by the State Bar Court, the remaining unpaid balance of the costs is due and payable immediately. Until they are paid in full, the costs remain enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

The court further orders that Dobbins's June 22, 2015, motion to shorten the time for the State Bar to respond to the motion for extension of time to pay costs is DISMISSED as moot.


