On January 26, 2017, Petitioner filed a motion seeking relief from her obligation to pay disciplinary costs to the State Bar. The amount of the cost obligation is \$4,044.

On January 31, 2017, the State Bar filed an opposition to the motion, arguing that the request was procedurally deficient since it was not accompanied by a completed financial statement, as is required by rule 5.130 of the State Bar Rules of Procedure.

On February 7, 2017, this court issued an order denying Petitioner's motion due to her failure to provide the required financial statement.

On March 14, 2017, Petitioner filed an Amended Motion for Relief from Payment of Disciplinary Costs. This motion included the required financial statement, as well as a declaration from Petitioner regarding her lack of income sufficient to pay the ordered cost obligation.

On March 16, 2017, the State Bar filed an opposition to the Amended Motion, pointing out that it cited to authorities now renumbered in the Rules of Procedure of the State Bar of California and opposing any reduction of Petitioner's obligation to pay costs. The opposition, however, did not oppose this court granting Petitioner an extension of time to pay those costs and/or creating an installment plan for those costs to be paid.

On March 27, 2017, Petitioner filed a modified Amended Motion for Relief from Payment of Disciplinary Costs, in which she merely corrected the citations to this court's authority to grant the relief being requested by her.

GOOD CAUSE having been shown, Petitioner's obligation to pay costs is hereby modified and extended as follows:

The amount of costs is reduced to \$4,000. These costs will be due and payable in five installments as follows:

- The first installment, in the amount of \$500, will be due on February 1, 2018;
- The second installment, in the amount of \$500, will be due on February 1, 2019;
- The third installment, in the amount of \$1,000, will be due on February 1, 2020;
- The fourth installment, in the amount of \$1,000, will be due on February 1, 2021; and
- The fifth installment, in the amount of \$1,000, will be due on February 1, 2022.

If Petitioner fails to pay any of the above installment payments more than 10 days after its due date without the prior written approval of the State Bar or the State Bar Court, the remaining unpaid balance of the costs will be due immediately and be enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

IT IS SO ORDERED.


