On December 27, 2018, we recommended that respondent B Harlan Field be summarily disbarred due to his felony conviction involving moral turpitude. Respondent has been on interim suspension since August 27, 2018, due to his conviction.

On January 9, 2019, the Office of Chief Trial Counsel of the State Bar (OCTC) filed a request that we vacate our summary disbarment recommendation because on June 15, 2018, respondent had filed a notice of appeal on his conviction with the California Court of Appeal, Second District. OCTC states that its initial transmittal of evidence of finality was in error and therefore summary disbarment is premature.

Good cause appearing, OCTC's request is granted. Our recommendation for summary disbarment is vacated. Respondent will remain on interim suspension status due to his felony conviction. Within 120 days of the date of this order, OCTC is ordered to submit evidence of finality or a report regarding the status of this matter.
